Processing Policy:

A. Midterm: ALL Ranks

- See page 1 for online registration submission date information.
- Registration deadline date is posted on the registration form for each event.
- Midterm registrations are subject to denial.
- Approval / denial letters will be sent 5-10 business days after submission of registration.
- ♦ Midterm Fees:
 - \$100.00 per event Registering no later than the posted deadline date
 - \$150.00 per event Registering 29 8 days prior to the event test date
 - \$200.00 per event Registering 7 days prior to the event test date or on site
- ♦ 1/1/2022: 4BD and above earning their rank in 2022 or later may receive credit for only one successful midterm per year.

B. Rank Test: Holding current rank 1BD – 2BR – 2BD & Retest ALL ranks:

- See page 1 for on-line registration submission date information.
- Registration deadline date is posted on the registration form for each event.
- Rank Test registrations are subject to denial.
- ♦ 1st Review: Approval / denial letters will be sent 5-10 business days after submission of registration.
- ♦ 2nd Review missing items: Applicant will be reviewed at posted deadline date. Applicant will be denied if 2nd review still shows missing items. This review is final.

- ♦ \$200.00 per event Registering no later than the posted deadline date

- ◆ \$400.00 per event Registering 7 days prior to the event test date or on site

C. Rank Test - Initial registration: Holding current rank 3rd Deg - 7th Deg:

- ♦ World and National Registration must be submitted to ATA Headquarters according to the Registration Submission Dates listed on page 1. Late registrations will not beaccepted.
- Registrations received after event Registration Closing Date will be DENIED.
- ♦ See page 1 for on-line registration submission date information.
- ◆ 1st Review: Initial Approval / denial letters will be sent 5 10 business days after submission of registration.
- ♦ 2nd Review is done the day following the deadline date: All testing requirements must be met OR be in house by the events posted deadline date. Applicant will be reviewed at posted deadline date. Applicant will be denied if deadline date review still shows missing items. This review is final, applicant will have to reapply to test at the next event.

- Minimum age requirement to participate at a National or World event 16 yrs old
- Minimum of 2 passing mi-terms with a score of 7 or higher
- ATA membership/Instructor Certification (if applicable) must be in good standing & current
- Senior Instructor's approval
- Board Breaking: Any (1) Hand tech. & Any (1) Kicking tech.
- LICENSEES: All ATA & WMA accounts & testing results must be up to date/paid in full
- LICENSEES: Legacy Facilitator status must be current
- Initial test & retest may be done at: In-school / Registered Regional / Nationals & World Events

<u>In school/Regional testing: Prequalification Application submission to ATAHQ</u> is required a minimum of 60 days prior to initial testing.

National & World Test App. must be submitted to ATAHQ 6 months prior to testing

- Minimum of 3 Passing midterms with a score of 7 or higher
- Level 1 Legacy Program status or higher
- Must be 18 yrs. of age or older
- ATA membership/Instructor Certification (if applicable) must be in good standing & current

- Initial test & retest may be done at: Registered Regional, National & World events.
 Regional testing: Prequalification Application submission to ATAHQ is required a minimum of 60 days prior to initial testing.
 - National & World Test App. must be submitted to ATAHQ 6 months prior to testing
- Minimum of 3 Passing midterms (see note at bottom of page 5)
- Certified Instructor Level
- Instructor Certification must be current & ATA Membership must be in good standing
- Senior Instructor's approval
- Board Breaking: Any (2) Hand tech. & Any (2) Kicking tech.
- Leadership points 360
- Accredited National Training Activity Participation must be met, if appropriate 2

5th Degree, testing toward 6th Degree Black Belt.

- Minimum of 5 years of time in rank as a 5th Degree Black Belt
- Initial testing must be at a World event. Retest may be done at a registered Regional, National or World event. Regional event: Judge Authority - Must have an ATA Grand Master or Master Council Member and a second judge at least 8BD in rank present and on the testing panel.
- Initial Test Application must be submitted to ATA HQ 6 months prior to the testing event
- Minimum of 3 Passing midterms (see note at bottom of page 5)
- Certified Instructor Level
- Instructor Certification must be current & ATA Membership must be in good standing
- Senior Instructor's approval
- Board Breaking: Must be submitted & approved by the Grand Master before testing
- Leadership point 450
- Accredited National Training Activity Participation must be met, if appropriate 5

- Minimum of 4 Passing midterms (see note at bottom of page 5)
- Certified Instructor Level
- Instructor Certification must be current & ATA Membership must be in good standing
- Senior Instructor's approval
- Board Breaking: Must be submitted & approved by Grand Master before testing
- Leadership points

- Minimum of 7 years of time in rank as a 7th Degree Black Belt
- Initial testing must be at a World event. Retest at National or World event
- Initial Test Application must be submitted to ATA HQ 6 months prior to the testing event
- Minimum of 4 passing midterms (see note at bottom of page 5)
- Certified Instructor Level
- Instructor Certification must be current & ATA Membership must be in good standing
- Senior Instructor's approval
- Board Breaking: Must be submitted & approved by the Grand Master before testing
- Leadership points 630
- Accredited National Training Activity Participation must be met, if appropriate 7
- LICENSEES: All ATA & WMA accounts & testing results must be up-to-date & paid in full
- LICENSEES: Legacy Facilitator status must be current

7th Degree Black Belt Midterms:

- If an individual attained the rank of 7th Degree Black Belt on or after July 10, 2014;
 - Minimum of 4 passing midterms (see note at bottom of page 5)
 - Midterms should be a maximum of 21 months apart (84 months divided by 4 midterms).
 - ** 7th Degrees who attained rank prior to July 10, 2014 are welcome to participate in midterms, it is optional. The current midterm fees are due at time of registration.

♦ Note - Passing Midterm Scores:

- 4BD 7BD: Midterms done before 10/22/2021 Passing sore is 8
- 4BD 7BD: Midterms done on or after 10/22/2021 Passing score is 7

Rank Advancement Passing Score – per applicant's current rank:

- 3BD: Minimum Passing score is 7 to advance to 4BD
- 4BD 7BD: Minimum Passing score is 8 to advance to next rank.

♦ Steps to becoming a 9th Degree

- Chief Masters are reviewed, selected and then nominated by the Presiding Grand Master and the Grand Master members of the Masters Council
- The selection process takes place during Spring Nationals each year.
- Rules for Eligibility
 - 3 Masters in Lineage
 - Time in grade 8 years (as an active member)
 - o Minimum age 56
- Invitation is given at Worlds 12 months prior to Martial Arts Presentation
- After receiving invitation, the invitee has 30 days to fill out the formal application
- Official Martial Arts Presentation (Testing Demonstration) during World's one year after approval by Council

- A total of 3 Elements must be performed during a midterm or rank test at a National or World event.
- During <u>rank testing</u>, you must perform your Taekwondo Form as one of the 3 Elements
- During <u>midterm testing</u>, you may substitute Protech for Taekwondo Form in which case, it will be worth a maximum of 4 points.
- When rank testing, if you do not break <u>all stations</u> within the three attempts, you will receive a No Change
- If you cannot spar or break boards for medical reasons, you may replace one Element with Protech Curriculum. (This must be approved by your instructor and the Presiding Grand Master prior to the midterm or rank testing.)
- Men and women 60 and older may go down one color for board breaks (women to green, men to blue).
- 1/1/2022: 4BD and above earning their rank in 2022 or later may receive credit for only one successful midterm per year.

Accredited National Participation

- ◆ 1/1/2013: All Black Belts age 18 years and up, awarded the rank of 4th Degree through 7th Degree Black Belt on or after January 1, 2013 are required to participate in Accredited National Leadership Training Activities as a requirement for their next rank testing.
- Current Rank Required QTY; Accredited Training Participation Activities
 - 4th Degree Black Belt 2
 - 5th Degree Black Belt 5
 - 6th Degree Black Belt 6
 - 7th Degree Black Belt 7
- Accredited National Training Activities are limited to the following ATA HQ hosted events with the specific names of (will garner one credit per event date):
 - World Conference
 - Spring & Fall Nationals Training Seminar Topics
 - National Leadership Camp ATA HQ hosted
 - National Protech Camp ATA HQ hosted
 - Korea Trips ATA HQ hosted
- The Master Title requires Accredited National Training Activity Participation.

 For a new 6th Degree to get the title of Master, <u>9 accredited seminars</u>, <u>OR average numbers of 200</u> are required. Seminars are tabulated via an individual's combined 4th and 5th degree participation (see next paragraph for important information).

Keep in mind that the minimum accredited seminars for a 4th degree to rank test is two (2). If, as a 4th Degree, an individual's goal is to get the Master Title – he/she should plan to do 1 accredited training activity per year for a total of 4 (or know that he/she will have to do extra's in another year to make up the difference – or wait extra years for the title while the difference is made up).

- ♦ Senior Master Title requires 6 Accredited National Training Activities or average numbers of 500. Seminars are tabulated via an individual's 6th degree time in rank.
- ◆ Chief Master Title requires 7 Accredited National Training Activities or average numbers of 1000. Seminars are tabulated via an individual's 7th degree time in rank.
- ♦ Grand Master Title Requirements
 - Member of the ATA Hall of Fame
 - 9 Masters in Linage
 - Time in grade as a 9th Degree 1 year

Leadership Points:

- Leadership Points accrue starting at an individual's date of rank, forward to their next testing date. Once an individual changes rank, point accumulation starts over from that new "date of rank". Leadership points can be obtained through, but are not limited to, a combination of the following;
 - Testing numbers
 - New member numbers
 - Tournament judging

- Testing guest judging
- World Conference
- Leadership Academy
- Legacy Academy
- National Camp participation
- Instructor Certification Camps
- Protech Seminars
- RAT / Elite Seminars
- Instruction Seminars
- Business Seminars
- Protech Certification/Camp
- Program/Material development (via HQ)
- Oversea activities (hosted by HQ ie. Korea Trip)
- Community Service (documentation or newspaper article required)

<u>Leadership Point Requirements by Rank</u> Current Rank Minimum Required Leadership Points

- 4th Degree Black Belt = 360
- 5th Degree Black Belt = 450
- 6th Degree Black Belt = 540
- 7th Degree Black Belt = 630
- 8th Degree Black Belt = 720
- There IS NO Grandfather clause individuals will not receive permission to test until the total required leadership points for their rank has been achieved.
- Individuals that fall short at the end of their required time in rank minimum must wait the extra year or years it takes to reach the required total for their rank.
- ♦ To test, individuals do not have to acquire leadership points in testing or new member numbers, they can make up the numbers by achieving points in other activities.
- ♦ Leadership points are NOT needed as a Master Title Requirement

Leadership Point Accumulation

- Numbers (are tabulated from the last full calendar year prior to testing date)
 - 4BD 100 new members or a test number average of 100 (600 yearly total)
 - 5BD 300 new members or a test number average of 200 (1200 yearly total)
 - 6BD 1000 new members or a test number average of 200 (1200 yearly total)
 - 7BD 3000 new members or a test number average of 500 (3000 yearly total)
 - 8BD 6000 new members or a test number average of 1000 (6000 yearly total)
 - Meeting 10% of required numbers = 5 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 20% of required numbers = 10 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 30% of required numbers = 15 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 40% of required numbers = 20 Leader points per year time in rank
 Meeting 50% of required numbers = 25 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 60% of required numbers = 30 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 70% of required numbers = 35 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 80% of required numbers = 40 Leader points per year time in rank
 - Meeting 100% of required numbers = 50 Leaders Points per year time in rank

 - 5 Points Guest Judge at a test Max 20 points per year

 - 10 Points Development of new programs No Maximum limit

 - 10 Points Community Outreach No Maximum limit
